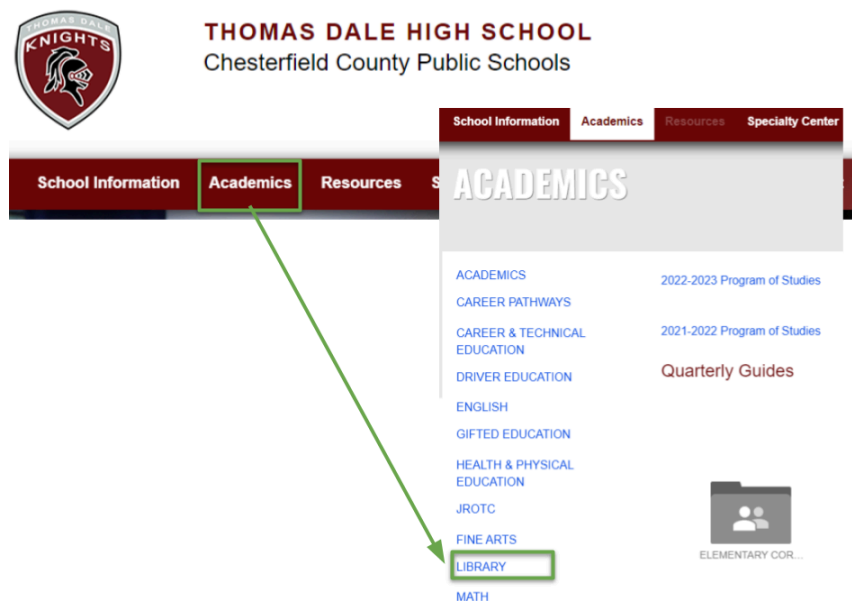


Opting Into Library Checkout Notifications (English)

Follow these steps to opt into library checkout notifications for your student.

1. Navigate to the website of your student's school. In this example, we'll use Thomas Dale High School. You can [view a complete listing of schools here](#).
2. Click on "Academics" and then "Library."



3. On the right sidebar, click on "Checkout Notifications."
